Stage 1 Friday, June 20th Catherine Creek Road Race

Stage 1 Catherine Creek Road Race Drivers/Radio Controllers:

Friday, June 20th, 8:30 a.m. Meet at Baker High School, Room 106, for a driver meeting and instructions with OBRA officials. After the meeting, move to the BHS parking lot, set up your radio equipment in your vehicle, specify your peloton, and organize your position within your caravan based on meeting instructions.

Stage 1 Catherine Creek Road Race Certified Flaggers:

Friday, June 20th[,] 8:30 a.m. Meet at Baker High School Parking Lot for set-up instructions and intersection locations. Flagger team organizers David and Niwa Flanagan will have equipment placed at intersections.

Stage 1 Catherine Creek Road Race Feed zone Teams:

Friday, June 20th, 8:30 a.m. Meet at Baker High School in the hallway between the basketball court and the stage for team instructions, water bottles, and supplies. BHS Girls Basketball will have bottles washed, filled, and ready for Teams placed along the hallway wall.

Stage 1 Catherine Creek Road Race Start/Finish Line Set-up crew.

Stage 2 Saturday, June 21st Baker City Time Trial

Stage 2 Baker City Time Trial Course Corner Marshals.

Saturday, June 21^{st,} 7:00 a.m. Meet at the Oregon Trail Electric Cooperative parking lot for instructions, signage, and gear. After getting signage and gear, head to the instructed corner to sweep gravel and debris and set up direction signage. Our race starts at 8:30. racers will be leaving the start area every 30 seconds. A sweep rider will inform corner marshals when the last rider has gone through. Expect racers to come through your corner for approximately 2.5 hours. We expect around 300 racers at this year's event.

Stage 2 Baker City Time Trial Start and Finish Helpers.

Saturday, June 21st⁷ 7:00 a.m. Meet at the Oregon Trail Electric Cooperative parking lot for instructions. We will divide up and send the finish-line helpers to the finish line at the start of the race. Start helpers will be providing start-whip communication and start-holder duties. Finish-line helpers will provide safety and communication to racers as they finish. Important: Baker City Time Trial finishes less than 300 yards from a train crossing. Finishing line helpers must secure finishers and keep them aware of this crossing before they prepare to return to OTEC or their lodging.

Stage 2 Baker City Time Trial Certified Flaggers.

Saturday, June 21st[,] 7:00 a.m. Meet at the Oregon Trail Electric Cooperative parking lot for instructions and set-up. Baker City Time Trial has one major intersection, the corner of Pocahontas and Wingville. Flagger coordinators David and Niwa Flanagan will have equipment placed at this intersection ready for execution.

Stage 2 Baker City Time Trial Start and Finish line setup crew.

Saturday, June 21st, 7:00 a.m. Meet at the Oregon Trail Electric Cooperative parking lot for instructions and set-up. Finish line Tents/Tables and Chairs will be set out beforehand. Start Barricades, tents, and the PA System must be unloaded from U-Haul.

Stage 3 Baker City Downtown Criterium course set team

Saturday, June 21st, 9:30 a.m. Meet at Washington and Main Street. The city will have street closure signs and wooden barricades placed near their positions. Team coaches will set up a map to ensure the correct setup. The barricade trailer and insulation bails will be unloaded and pulled through the course. Start/Finish scaffolding will need to be set up, and signs will need to be placed. Shimano Course marking tape will need to be stung around the inside and outside of the course. Note: Course Set-up teams save energy for specific OBRA officials and Timing/Camera area set-up will be directed by the race director.

Stage 3 Baker City Downtown Criterium Corner Marshals

Saturday, June 21st[,] 12:30 p.m. Meet at Washington and Main Street for instructions and course positions. Corner marshal coordinator Renea Cimmiyotti will assign shifts and hand out whistles and Hi-Viz vests.

Stage 3 Baker City Downtown Criterium Moto Team

Saturday, June 21^{st,} 12:30 p.m. Meet at Washington and Main Street for instructions and a prerace course check. Criterium racing starts at 1:00 p.m. The Moto team will rotate riders over the six hours of racing. At least three Moto riders will be needed to cover shift rotation.

Stage 3 Baker City Downtown Criterium Take Down Team

Saturday, June 21st, 6:30 p.m. Meet at Washington and Main Street for instructions. The barricade trailer will be loaded as it pulls through the course. U-Haul will move through the course for insulation bales. City street closure signs and wooden barricades must be packed and stacked near corners. PA System and start-finish scaffolding will need to be placed in U-Haul. Shimano course tape and all garbage will need to be picked up. Downtown Baker City must look like race never happened, leaving no trace of Baker City Downtown Criterium.
